### ANNEX ANTIQUE FAIR & FLEA MARKET

Dealer Catherine DeLattre always leaves this downtown flea market with a beautiful piece of ironstone or a funky painting. "There are unusual, great pieces," says Catherine, whose favorite destination is the indoor garage. ### PASADENA CITY COLLEGE FLEA MARKET

"This is a real flea market—nothing fancy, nothing glamorous," says Kate Shifrin, owner of Come Flea With Me, a company that organizes bus trips to antiques and flea markets across the country. Look for everything from vintage Hollywood memorabilia to junk. ### LINCOLN ROAD ANTIQUES AND COLLECTIBLES MARKET
